
Our process

- Focuses on real spiritual needs, concerns, issues
- Projects OCC's progressive, inclusive, relational spirit
- Creative, adventurous, aspirational, flexible, risk-taking
- Takes advantage of our true strengths and gifts
- Full of grace, gratitude, courage, joy and love
